3. To confirm the minutes of the Police Liaison Committee meeting held on Monday 7<sup>th</sup> June 2021 (**copy enclosed**).

4. Update from last meeting.  
Unfortunately Dyfed Powys and British Transport police are unable to attend meetings however they are happy to receive updates. It will be offered to alter the times of the meeting so that it could be more available.
5. Data sharing.  
Document was sent out prior to the meeting. Cllr Robert John **PROPOSED** that the Town Clerk writes a letter to CCC, DPP and BTP to ask that under section 115, we be considered as a relevant partner for data sharing.
6. Summer strategy.  
An action plan will assist all agencies to plan on what need to be done by all. CDO asked to look at the possibility of volunteer community wardens in a sited building at the harbour to have a presence at the harbour at weekends, this would be in conjunction with all other partners. Details of our plans to be shared with CCC and police, also informing chief commissioner and Chief Exec of CCC.
7. Carmarthenshire County Council Community Wardens.  
It was noted that these were in place as paid CCC wardens at Tyisha and Glanymor, enquiries to be made to consider them for Burry Port.

8. Any other business at the discretion of the chair.  
It was noted that the youth club has not been reopened, CDO to contact youth service to see if this could change. Various local ASB incidents were discussed, and our combined efforts are needed to combat these.

It was noted that signs haven't been put up at the sluice gate that were agreed on May 6<sup>th</sup>. CDO asked to follow up with Bob Hockey to see if these can be done, as it is a very dangerous area.

Cllr Les George asked whether there are still special constables in the area, CDO to find out how many.
